

The City of Newark's Summer Youth Employment Program and Altice USA Host *Real World Connections Chat* with U.S. Senator Cory Booker, Newark Mayor Ras Baraka, and Altice USA CEO Dexter Goei

August 8, 2018 (New York) -- Altice USA yesterday hosted the *Real World Connections Chat* with U.S. Senator Cory Booker (D-NJ) and Newark Mayor Ras Baraka in partnership with the City of Newark's Summer Youth Employment Program together to reinforce the importance of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) and real-world life experiences for education success. The event was held at the New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT) in Newark, and featured a discussion with Senator Booker, Mayor Baraka, Altice USA CEO Dexter Goei, and high school students participating in The Summer Coding Initiative at NJIT.

The Summer Coding Initiative is held in partnership with the City of Newark Summer Youth Employment Program and provides 20 selected Newark residents ages 16 - 18 access to real-world coding experiences and opportunities to engage with technology and community leaders. The program offers highly motivational learning environments in STEM that makes learning relevant, challenging and exciting as it becomes powered by learning-by-doing, real world experiences, students' ownership and social integration. The program leverages expert coaching, multi-tier mentorship and project-based learning with real world clients or based on entrepreneurship. As part of the 2018 program, students also experienced how technology plays a role in cable operations during a recent visit to Altice's headend video and data control center in Parsippany, NJ. In addition, several Altice leaders spent time at NJIT reviewing the student projects and providing coaching and mentorship for real-world application.

U.S. Senator Cory Booker said: "Smart investments in our nation's STEM education, which is falling behind competitor nations, is key to strengthening the future of our economy and preparing students for a 21st Century workforce. We must remain committed to ensuring students in communities like Newark have equal access to educational opportunities in the STEM field in order to pave the way for their future success."
